

# Neil Jeffares, *Dictionary of pastellists before 1800*

### **ALPHEN, Eusebius Johann**

Vienna 1741–1772

Variously spelt Alf, Alfen, Alwen. Pastellist and miniaturist, working with Jean-Baptiste Massé (*q.v.*) in Paris in 1764 where he was spotted by Höyer (*q.v.*) who noted “M. Alwen de Vienne, peintre de la première force en miniature, en émail & en pastel”. Subsequently he was court painter in Vienna. A number of miniatures are in the Österreichische Nationalbibliothek in Vienna. Several copies after van Dyck bear an abbreviated signature which it is here suggested is his. He appears in Mozart’s letters and may be responsible for a well-known miniature of the composer and his sister.
