Pupil of Giuliano Cesare Angeli and of the mathematician Lemme Rossi. He was a religious painter, portraitist and draughtsman; Nagler says he also worked in pastel, Spooner reporting that he "commenced portrait painting in crayons, and acquired so much reputation as to be invited to practice at Rome". He founded a drawing school in Perugia.
