ANGELINI, Constanzo

San Giusta degli Abruzzi 22.X.1760 – Naples 22.VI.1853

Portraitist and religious painter, trained in Rome but influenced by David. Around 1790 he was brought to Naples by Sir William Hamilton, to draw his second collection of antique vases for the publication organised by Wilhelm Tischbein (q.v.). He became drawing master at the Accademia di Belle Arti, numbering among his pupils his own son Tito and becoming renowned for his academies. He also portrayed Nelson. Later he was commissioned by Caroline Murat to portray Joseph Bonaparte and others in oil, for the Palazzo Reale in Caserta. He also produced chalk drawings.
