AUBRY, Louis-François

Paris 27.II.1767–16.I.1851

Important early nineteenth century miniaturist; pupil at the Académie royale from 1784 to 1791, studying under Durameau and Vincent. Later he worked in Isabey's studio. He was the son of Louis Aubry (*q.v.*) by his third wife, Marie-Adélaïde Fournier, and he married Claude-Victoire Lemaire in Paris, 9.II.1795. In 1810 Vivant Denon mentioned him to Napoléon as “parmi les peintres en miniatures les plus habile de l'Europe”. It is unclear how reliable are the attributions to him of the couple of pastels which have appeared.
