BRIARD, Gabriel

Paris 1729–18.XI.1777

History painter, best known as the teacher of Vigée Le Brun (q.n; he also taught de Marne, q.n.). He was a pupil of Natoire in 1748, winning the prix de Rome the following year. He worked in Rome for the next four years. Back in Paris, he was agréé 1761; reçu 1768. The posthumous sale of his collection of paintings and drawings (where he was described as Peintre du roi & professeur en son Académie royale de peinture & sculpture) included a pastel of his teacher as well as a sketch in chalk with touches of pastel. One other early sale record is the only further indication that he worked in this medium.
