BACCIARELLI, Marcello

Rome 16.II.1731 – Warsaw 5.I.1818

After studies in Rome, he was summoned in 1750 to Dresden by August III. There he married the miniaturist Friederike Richter (q.v.). In 1756 he travelled to Warsaw where the artist spent the rest of his life (apart from an interval in Vienna, 1764–66), becoming official painter and director of fine arts for Stanisław August. He does not appear to have made pastels, although much confusion resulted from the proliferation of copies and repetitions by artists in the Polish school, many of whom used pastel under the influence of Louis Marteau.
