BAILLIE, William

England ?1753 – Calcutta 7.VI.1799 Painter, draughtsman and engraver. He went to India in 1777 to serve in the Bengal Infantry, but transferred to the Engineers and became a surveyor. Ten years later he resigned his commission but remained active as a topographical artist. He also established a newspaper, the *Calcutta Chronicle*. According to his letter to Humphry, he intended to take up pastels with Russell's treatise as guide. It is not known if he did so.
