BALSA DE FIRMY, Marie-Catherine-Claudine

Toulouse 18.IX.1766-4.XII.1835

Mlle Balza, Balsa, Balsac or Balzac de Firmi, or Firmy, was a pupil of Sabère, Suau and Roques, recorded between 1784 and 1788. A member of the family of magistrates at the parlement de Toulouse, she was the daughter of Jean-Jacques de Balza, baron de Firmy, who inherited the hôtel de Burta (56 rue Pharaon) in 1779, and his wife, née Jeanne-Anne de Berdolle de Goudouville. He was guillotined in 1794 for opposing the decrees of the Assemblée constituante. Only two daughters are recorded: Anne-Jacquette-Jeanne-Marie-Colombe-

Honorée, baptised at Saint-Étienne, Toulouse 21.I.1765, died 24.X.1845, married, in the same church, 17.VII.1783, Joseph-Marie-Louis de Puymirol, seigneur de Sirac (1744–1815): she cannot be the Mlle de Firmy in 1788, who must be her younger sister, Marie-Catherine-Claudine, born the following year. She seems to have abandoned art soon after, and died umarried in Toulouse, place d'Orléans.
