## **BARDIN, Ambroise-Marguerite, Mme Pierre-François Mollière**

Charmentray 20.V.1768 – Paris 26.III.1842

Portraitist in oil, miniature and pastellist; pupil of her father Jean Bardin (1732–1809), directeur de l'école de dessin d'Orléans and himself a former pupil of Lagrenée l'aîné and Pierre. Her mother was Marie-Madeleine Le Gein (c.1742–1805). On 11.II.1793 at Orléans she married Pierre-François Mollière (1753–1814), a drawing teacher and assistant of Bardin at the école de dessin; they later established a porcelain factory. A “Mlle Bardin soeur” advertised pastel and other drawing materials in the *Journal de Loiret*, 23.XI.1791 (*v. Suppliers*), from the école: Jean Bardin and his wife had at least two other children (one of whom Étienne-Alexandre, baron Bardin, was a general: the parrain at his baptism, in 1774, was the engraver Étienne Fessard), but no sister is recorded. However, Ambroise-Marguerite's marrain (she was baptised at Charmentray, 22.V.1768, two days after her birth) was “demoiselle Marguerite Bardin tante de l'enfant”. A list of the patriotic donations of citizens of Orléans (published in the *Journal de Loiret*, 4.XII.1789, p. 3) included MM. Bardin père and fils, as well as “Mme Bardin”, “Mlle Bardin” and “Mlle Bardin tante”. This suggests that the art supplier must have been Bardin's sister rather than his daughter.
