BEDFORD, Duchess of, née Lady Gertrude Leveson-Gower

Staffordshire 15.II.1715 – Chenies 1.VII.1794
The Knole pastel copy of Chardin's Jeune dessinateur taillant son crayon (n. Chardin) was traditionally attributed to a Duchess of Bedford, presumably Gertrude, second wife of the 4th Duke and Duchess of Bedford from 1737 on. Carritt (1974) argued that this is a confusion between the pastellist John Russell and his homonym, but in a letter to her husband in Paris in 1748, Lady Anson (q.n.) asks him to buy crayons for the Duchess of Bedford. Walpole noted a "bad" pastel by Gertrude, Duchess of Bedford during one of his visits to country seats. She was described as "extremely stingy and avaricious".
