BERNERO, Luigi

Turin 1775–1842

Luigi Bernero was the second son of the sculptor Giovanni Battista Bernero (1736–1796), from Cavallerleone, active in Turin from 1770. Luigi and his brother Vittorio Amedeo were born in 1775 and 1773 respectively (or possibly the other way round); each was active as both painter and sculptor. In 1793 Luigi was awarded the first prize in drawing at the Accademia; he was possibly a student of Laurent Pécheux. In 1794 he was admitted to the Compagnia di San Luca in Turin; three years later he and his brother were appointed directors of the guild. In 1794 he married Graglia or Margarita Calliano (1776–1838), the daughter of a furrier Bernardo and Genovese Crosa (her brothers Raffaele Antonio and Giovanni Battista were painters); his daughter Margherita Adelaide married the engraver and painter Angelo Boucheron. One record has him in Alessandria in 1810. He was recorded as an artist in the royal service, “col titolo di Pittore di ritratti”, in the Turin 1824 *Calentario generale pe’ regii stati*.

The identified portraits in pastel seem to be early nineteenth century, although two unknown subjects probably belong to the Directoire period on costume grounds; one small oval is dated 1794. His inscriptions are in French, spelling his forename as Lovis.
