BRABAND, Isaak

Berlin c.1726 – Wrocław 9.I.1790

From Berlin; pupil of Pesne and “Mathieux” (presumably David Matthieu), active for many years in Wrocław as a portraitist in oil, pastel and miniature. He preferred history painting to portraiture. His composition, shading and coloration were all praised as giving his painting spirit and life. Apart from works in Berlin collections, an altarpiece in the Minoritenkirche in Cosel (Kędzierzyn-Koźle) were known in 1794. An oil portrait of Ludwig von Korkwitz, 1775, is in the Nationalmuseum, Wrocław. He taught the miniaturist Gottfried August Thilo (1766–1855). He died aged 63.
