CAMMAS, Mme Lambert-François-Thérèse, née Marie-Françoise Bouton

Toulouse 12.xI.1753–10.III.1840
Miniaturist. The daughter (one of 25 children) of a miniaturist, Guillaume-Gabriel, dit Joseph Bouton (1730–1782), she married Lambert-François-Thérèse Cammas (*q.v.*) in 1772. Their daughter Marie-Anne-Gabrielle-Guilhaumette, Mme Guibal (1781–1841) was also a painter and miniaturist. Marie-Françoise and her husband were godparents of the nephew of the pastellist Pierre Cézeron (*q.v.*).

Marie-François exhibited several pastels before devoting herself to miniatures, for which she won the prix de peinture de l'école de l'Académie in 1779, the first in which ladies were allowed to compete (for a description of the competition, r. s.n. Carré). She was appointed the following year as associée honoraire of the Toulouse académie. Her reception pieces included a portrait d'après nature and a copy after Carle Van Loo. Her address is given as rue du poids de l'Huile in Baour's 1782 Almanach historque de la ville de Toulouse (p. 200).
