CHARPENTIER, Mme Victor-François, née Constance-Marie Blondelu

Paris 4.IV.1767–2.VIII.1849

Portraitist. The daughter of Pierre-Alexandre-Hyacinthe Blondelu and Marie-Angélique Dubacq, on 6.V.1793, she married a merchant whose sister was Danton's first wife. She was a pupil of David, Wille, Lafitte, and (after 1793) of Gérard and Bouillon; she exhibited in Salons from 1795. Her work seems to be entirely in oil, although one signed miniature is known, and one pastel, hitherto considered as a self-portrait of Marie-Victoire Lemoine, has been attributed to her (*v. Éc. fr.*).
