CIPRIANI, Giovanni Battista

Florence 1727 – London 14.XII.1785 A pupil of Bartolozzi, around 1750 he moved to London, where he restored the Rubens ceiling in Whitehall. He was a prolific draughtsman, engraver and copyist. A number of chalk drawings employ blue or green colours that are likely to be pastel, but they are not catalogued in full here. His son Sir Henry Cipriani (1761– 1844) is said to have done some pastels (and was admitted to the Royal Academy Schools on 31.III.1777 "aged 15 last December") before turning to a military career.
