CORNU, Gabriel

Paris bpt 21.i.1693–.x.1763

A pupil of Largillierre; adjoint à professeur, he exhibited at the Salon de Saint-Luc in 1751, 1752 and 1753 (rue de la Harpe), including some pastel landscapes in 1751. He was dismissed by Mariette as “né sans le moindre talent, et presque aveugle, il est demeuré dans la plus extrême médiocrité, et cependant ayant la manie de vouloir peindre les tableaux dont personne ne vouloit.” He was surely the Gabriel Cornu, bourgeois de Paris, son of Jean, sculpteur du roi, baptised 21.i.1693 at Saint-Germain-l’Auxerrois, with Gabriel Blanchard, peintre du roi, as parrain; on 13.x.1731 (by contract of 12.x.1731, AN MC/LX/248: Mariette was among the witnesses), he married (as her second husband) Geneviève Hérisant, daughter of a Parisian libraire and widow of a médecin de la faculté de Paris.
