COYPEL, Noël-Nicolas

Paris 17.XI.1690–14.XII.1734

According to his obituary (Éloge de Noël-Nicolas Coypel, collection Deloynes), Charles Coypel's brother is supposed to have used pastel for highlights in his drawings of heads and half-length figures, and in his last years he turned to portraiture in oil and in pastel;

il a si parfaitement réussi dans ce dernier talent [le pastel] que chacun s'empressait à lui en demander les preuves; on y trouve la fraîcheur de la chair, un maniment de pastel admirable, une légèreté de main surprenante; la vérité, la vie, l'esprit y sont exprimées.

There is confirmation in his posthumous inventory, which includes “deux boetes à pastelle” in addition to four pastels presumably by the artist; Philippe Cayeux reclaimed a frame and glass which he had lent Coypel for an unfinished pastel “testes d'enfant”.

Noël-Nicolas Coypel was appointed (with Jean-Baptiste Gilles Colson) to adjudicate a dispute over the resemblance and value of a pastel by Pierre Duval (*q.v.*), in a dispute of 1732 (AN Y4479^B).

Apart from confusions with the other members of the family, there is a special difficulty with unseen works recorded as by Noël Coypel (1628–1707), who does not seem to have made pastels.

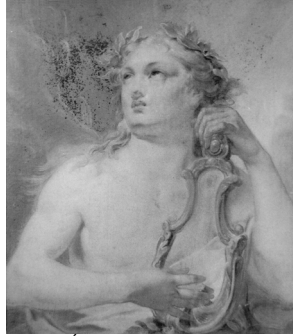
