Amateur exhibitor of picturesque landscapes in pastel at the Free Society in 1772 from York Street, near Portland Chapel. He may well have been Admiral Crawley (1756 – Waterhouse, Bath 1835), the son of a purser in the Royal Navy. He entered the navy as a midshipman in 1769 and reached the rank of admiral in 1830. However the obituary in the *Gentleman's magazine* does not mention an artistic hobby.
