CUYCK, Carolina Pieternella van

The Hague bpt 6.XI.1749 – ?Bruxelles c.1813 Also Petronella. The daughter of Pieter II van Cuyck and Catharina du Bois, she was taught by her father and her uncle Karel van Cuyck (q.v.). She painted landscapes in miniature, and also produced historical subjects, as well as portraits. Although few pastels are recorded, a copy (in "crayons") of van Bleeck's famous oil portrait of Coenraet Roepel was donated it to the confrerie Ut Pictura in The Hague, which appointed her an honorary member in 1777. (A pen and wash version of the Bleeck portrait (Rijksprentenkabinet, inv. 12:31 attributed to Bleeck as a preliminary study, cannot be van Cuyck's presentation piece as it is not in pastel.)

A pastel bearing an illegible signature is here suggested as by her: it has be read as J.C. L. C..., but could be J[ongfrouw] C[arolina] P[ieternella] Cuijck.
