London 1.IV.1741–14.I.1825

A founder member of the Royal Academy, draughtsman and (like his father) architect, exhibiting in 1770 and 1771 from Chiswell Street; 1785, from Salisbury Street, and from 1795 to 1800 from Upper Gower Street. From 1798 to 1800 he turned to profile portraits executed in what is described as pastel, but may just be chalk.
