DAVIDSON, George

Boston 1768 – Pacific Ocean 1800
Topographer and draughtsman on the *Columbia*, a ship owned by Joseph Barrell of Boston which made a voyage to Canton in the period 1790–93. In 1799 he took command of the *Rover*, intending to repeat the trip, but he was drowned in a storm in the Pacific Ocean. He was the son of Alexander Davidson, a merchant seaman from Aberdeen who emigrated to Boston. An unpublished memorandum by George's daughter, Mary, Mrs Stowell, is in the archives of the New England Historic Genealogical Society (MSS L 1511).
