DAY, Thomas

?Devon c.1732 – ?London c.1807

Portraitist in pastel and miniature; pupil of Dodd and Humphry (qq.v.). He was admitted to the Royal Academy Schools on 24.II.1770. He exhibited only pastels at the Royal Academy between 1773 and 1777 from 11 Little Titchfield Street, near Cavendish Square (1773), Brentwood (1774) and 24 Great Portland Street (1775-77), thereafter switching to miniatures, which he continued to show until 1788. As Foskett explained, the confusions surrounding this artist are legion, and there are no doubt some erroneous conflations in the secondary sources. Long reports a pastel reminiscent of Russell; the profiles in the 1927 sale are not. The basis of Sée's attribution to "Henry Thomas Day" in the 1927 catalogue is unclear, and possibly unreliable.
