DELL'ERA, Giovan Battista

Treviglio 20.V.1765 - Florence 7.I.1799 History painter, portraitist, draughtsman and copyist, he worked in Bergamo, where he was a pupil of Francesco Cappella detto il Daggiù (1711–1784); in Milan (the Accademia di Brera provided him with a grant supporting him in Rome from 1791 to 1795); Bologna (1787); Rome, where he fell under the influence of Angelika Kauffmann; and Florence (becoming a member of the Accademia di Belle Arti in 1789). Under the influence of Reiffenstein (q.v.) he became interested in techniques such as encaustic painting. It is not clear on what basis he is mentioned in sources as a pastellist.
