The amateur pastellist signing EBD who copied a portrait by Liotard of Elisabeth Fagel was her cousin, Elisabeth Bonifacia Dierkens or Dierquens. She was the daughter of Johan, or Joan, Pieter Dierkens, who, in 1731 at The Hague, married Elisabeth Agneta Fagel, the daughter of the wealthy councillor Cornelis Gerrit Fagel. Dierkens was a burgemeester in The Hague and held various offices and charitable roles. On 29.XII.1765 in The Hague Elisabeth Bonifacia married Coenraad Diederik Neomagus Singendonck, heer van Dieden (1727–1792), postmeester-generaal. No pastels are recorded after her marriage.
