DORIGNY, Michel

Saint-Quentin 1617 – Paris 20.II.1665
Religious and history painter and prolific draughtsman, trained by his father-in-law Vouet (q.n.; he married Jeanne-Angélique in Paris in 1648); repu 1663. A study for a ceiling in the Hôtel Lambert has now been restored to Dorigny, with previous attributions indicating the development of Dorigny's work from Vouet to a more classical style. The use of pastel seems to be confined to some blue chalk. Two of his sons, Louis (1654–1742) and Nicolas (1658–1746), became engravers.
