DUGOURC, Jean-Démosthène

Versailles 23.IX.1749 – Paris 30.IV.1825

Also Dugoure; architect and decorative artist in various media, brought up in the household of the duc d'Orléans; dessinateur du Cabinet du comte de Provence. He was in Rome 1764–66. The only indication that he used pastel was the drawing in the Sorbet sale described in Eudore Soulié's letter to comte de Nieuwerkerke just before the auction.
