DUMONSTIER, Daniel

Paris 14.V.1574–22.VI.1646

Member of the Dumonstier (variously spelt Du Moutier etc.) family of artists; nephew of Étienne II and Pierre I; painter to Henri IV, Louis XIII and Gaston d'Orléans. He was also an important connoisseur and collector, and was accomplished in many fields: Le Comte noted that "il avoit l'esprit des plus enjoués & joüoit de differens instrumens; son merite particulier lui attira l'estime du Prince qui lui avoit decerné une bonne pension dont il a toujours loüi jusques à la mort." His portraits were often executed in coloured chalks, and may have additions in pastel, but no work completely in pastel is known. Norgate described his method, but dismissed his work as "a French trifle".

Technical details in some older auction records may not observe such distinctions: sheets from Lot 961 in the Crozat sale may well have reappeared in the Mariette sale, under Lot 1228, where they are more accurately described as in black, red and white chalk. The definitive monograph by Daniel Lecœur, published in 2006, lists a number of sheets which include touches of pastel as well as chalk; one is in Rosenberg 2011 (F1725, the marquis de Sillery, Louvre inv. 26366), while another example, F1728, inconnu, Nelson-Atkins Museum, inv. 34-132) is not in Lecœur. All are omitted here, bar a few historical records.
