DUSAULCHOY DE BERGEMONT, Joseph-François-Nicolas

Toul 21.II.1760 – Paris 25.VII.1835
Journalist and playwright as well as amateur artist and traveller. He worked on the Gazette d'Amsterdam during his stay in The Netheralnds. Back in France he edited various revolutionary papers. Imprisoned during the Terror, he subsequently worked for the police, monitoring the media, before retruning to journalism. His anonymous memoirs recount a visit to Braunschweig, where he was received by the governor. He assembled the necessary equipment for painting, including "crayons", only to be told that his host "aimait les tableaux, mais il n'en achetait pas, il était avare".
