DUVIVIER, Jean-Bernard

Bruges 22.VI.1762 – Paris 14.XI.1837

History painter, portraitist, draughtsman and printmaker. After initial study in Bruges, he was taught by Joseph-Benoît Suvée in Paris from 1783. His draughtsmanship secured numerous prizes, but not the Grand Prix, and his trip to Rome from 1790 was at his own expense (and with support from a patron, Boudelet). He remained in Italy for some six years, sending work to the Paris salons. Not known as a pastellist, the sole example to come to light may be dated 1790 or 1796; the subject may be religious or classical.
