ENSLEN, Gottfried Christian

Stuttgart 27.XII.1757 – 22.I.1818

The signature (which appears on only one of the identically framed pastels) of the artist responsible for a group of works which surfaced in 2017 was transcribed by the auction house as Ernstens and misread here (until 2023) as Emten. The name is printed Enslen, in a notice that appeared in the *Affiches de Strasbourg*, 19.II.1791, printed both in French and German, reducing the risk of typographical error:

Le Sr. Enslen, peintre, demeurant sur le vieux marché aux Grains, No. 18, enseigne à dessiner & à peindre en huile & au pastel.

He is evidently the Gottfried Christian Enslen, who, with his brother Johann Carl Enslen (Stuttgart 21.V.1759 – Dresden 10.XII.1848), referred to as “sieur Enslen, ingénieur-physicien de Strasbourg” and were the sons of Johann Friedrich Enslen, vernisseur à la cour de Wurtemberg. They were based in Strasbourg from 1783, and were captivated by the Mongolfier balloons which inspired a topographical watercolour of an aerostat from the citadel of Strasbourg signed and dated by Charles Enslen in 1784. (By 1795 he had moved to Gdańsk and in 1811 was in Berlin.) Gottfried Christian married Sophie Gross, daughter a member of the Grand Sénat in Schiltigheim on 21.II.1786 (his signature on the register matches that on the pastel apart from the curious, misleading horizontal stroke through the l), and seems to have remained in Strasbourg for longer. He is mentioned in 1791 and 1813 as professeur de dessin et restaurer, and as having worked on fixing pastels.

He may perhaps have been a student of Huin (q.v.), from whose work these four pastels are indistinguishable; Huin had previously portrayed members of the same family.
