ENGLEHEART, George

Kew 26.X.1750 – Blackheath 21.III.1829
Miniaturist. The son of a German plastermodeller who had settled in England,
Engleheart entered the Royal Academy Schools
in 1769. He was a pupil of George Barret (*q.n.*)
and Sir Joshua Reynolds, exhibiting at the Royal
Academy from 1773. His surviving account
books include nearly 5000 miniatures. While it is
possible that he experimented with pastel as a
student, the attribution of the pastel in the 1911
exhibition is simply wrong, that in Victoria does
not seem to be signed, and the main evidence
that Engleheart worked in pastel is in an
unillustrated letter by Robert Dell which
describes two pastels with strong affinities to
Cosway, one of which was signed.
