ERIKSEN, Vigilius

Copenhagen 2.IX.1722–25.V.1782

Eriksen, or Erichsen (in work transliterated from Russian), was a history and portrait painter, miniaturist and pastellist. A pupil of Johann Salomon Wahl, Hofporträtmaler to Christian VI, although he was already a successful portraitist, in 1755 he competed unsuccessfully for the history painting prize at the academy. In 1757 Eriksen travelled to St Petersburg and became painter to Catherine the Great, remaining until 1772. Here his success was such that, in 1763, Andreas Schumacher noted that he charged the same fee as Louis Tocqué. Apart from the imposing imperial portraits he painted, the Empress also commissioned her own portrait in old Russian dress. Although lost, it is known from copies and engravings, and may be the pastel for which Eriksen received 300 roubles in 1769 (Central State Historical Archive of St Petersburg, ф. 468, оп. 1, ч. 2, ед. хр. 3882, л. 238). The payment may alternatively refer to Eriksen's curious portrait of a 108-year old peasant from Tsarskoye Selo with her children, executed in the frieze-like pastel reminiscent of work being done at the same time by Lorenzo Tiepolo (*q.v.*). Three years later a full-length oil version was commissioned by the Empress, and this was later engraved. In 1772 Eriksen returned to Copenhagen, where he was made court painter and later a counsellor of state. The Rosenborg pastel of the Danish queen shows his work in this medium to be of a very high quality, with strong colours and a painterly finish.
