FERRARI, Pietro Melchiorre

Sissa 2.II.1735- Parma 3.X.1787

Painter of history and religious pictures and portraits, copyist. The son of an architect, he was initially taught by abate Giuseppe Peroni and, in Bologna, by Vittorio Bigari. On his return to Parma, he was a pupil of Baldrighi (q.n.). Subsequently he became professor in the Parma academy and was appointed court painter to Ferdinando IV in 1785. He was a close friend of the Ghidini family, a group portrait of whom, previously attributed to Baldrighi, has been restored to Ferrari (London, Sotheby's, 5.XII.2012, Lot 45, saleroom notice). It is unclear if he is the author of the competent pastel that has been attributed to him.
