

# Neil Jeffares, *Dictionary of pastellists before 1800*

### **FIORILLO, Johann Dominik**

Hamburg 13.X.1748 – Göttingen 10.IX.1821  
Also Giovanni Domenico or Dominicus. Art historian, painter and draughtsman, born in Hamburg to a family from Naples. Trained in Bayreuth and Rome, he worked in Bologna (becoming a member of the Accademia Clementina) and Braunschweig before settling in Göttingen in 1781. Here he was Professor der Philosophie und Ausseher der Gemälded- und Kupferstich-Sammlung der Königl. Churfürstl. Universität, according to the title page of one of his publications (1806). In 1813 he was the first person to be appointed to a chair dedicated to the history of art. His *Geschichte der zeichnenden Künste von ihrer Wiederauflebung bis auf die neuesten Zeiten* appeared in Göttingen from 1796. The self-portrait, described as a miniature-pastell, may not properly belong to this *Dictionary*. Among Fiorillo's drawing pupils was the English scientist Thomas Young.
