### FITZPATRICK, Lady Anne

?Ampthill Park 1774 – Farming Woods, Northamptonshire 11.XII.1841

Daughter of the Earl of Upper Ossory and his wife, divorced from the Duke of Grafton, the correspondent of Walpole; herself, as a child, the subject of a portrait by Reynolds engraved under the title of Sylvia. Four pastels by Rosalba are also recorded at Ampthill (the family seat later owned by the Holland and Russell families); they may have been acquired under the influence of the Countess's relative Peter Delme. The numerous illegitimate children of the Earl has led to certain confusions over their dates: Lady Anne died unmarried, as did her younger sister Lady Gertrude, the two last surviving members of the family.
