FLAXMAN, Mary Ann

London bpt 31.VII.1768–17.IV.1833
Half-sister of the sculptor John Flaxman; she exhibited at the Royal Academy from 1786 to 1819 as an amateur. She travelled to Italy and Germany (Weimar) as governess to the Hare-Naylor family, returning to London in 1810 to live with her brother. Her pastels are said to have been inspired by those of Carriera. She also worked in oil, in miniature and as a wax modeller.
