## GUÉNARD

*fl.* France 1680

Unrecorded. A Jean Guénard, peintre, leased a property at rue Neuve-Saint-Honoré for five years from 1647. He may have been the same Jean Guénard, peintre, of rue de la Corderie, whose wife, Charlotte François, was marraine at the baptism of a friend at Saint-Roch, 15.IX.1647. The following year, at the same church, “Jean Guénard, maître peintre, rue de la Corderie” was himself parrain at another baptism. Also at Saint-Roch, 17.I.1645 he was again parrain, living this time in the rue Gaillon. A René Guénard (or Quenard), peintre, husband of Marguerite Moufle since 1673, died in 1687, leaving an 11-year old son Hélié (registres de tutelles).
