HIRSCHMANN, Franz Ludwig

Bamberg 1775 – Hamburg p.1821

Younger brother of Johann Adam and Johann Baptist Hirschmann (*qq.v.*). He is known from several pastels in America, several of which are well into the nineteenth century. He originated in Bamberg and was active also in Hof. He was in the USA by 1791 and still there in 1812, but was back in Hamburg by 1818. He is probably the pastellist Hinckman active in the USA in 1793 mentioned in some sources (e.g. Young). A painting of Max I. Ludwig, dated 1821, is presumably by the same artist.
