HONNETTE, Jean-François

Blâmont 28.XII.1733 – Frankfurt am Main
13.VII.1802

Also Honnête; Johann Franz etc. Self-taught pastellist and miniaturist. The son of a marchand mercier Georges Honnette and Marie-Thérèse Masson, he moved from his native Lorraine to Frankfurt am Main in 1762 where he married a Maria Catharina Schniders in the Evangelisches Kirch on 22.IV.1764 and became a citizen. In 1763 he made several trips to Vienna to make portraits of members of the imperial family and other nobles. He also worked in Mainz and Bruxelles (1782). An advertisement in the *Gazette de Liège* on 19.III.1783 was placed by a bookseller, F. J. Desoer, asking “M. Honnette, Peintre en miniature” to make contact to receive information, suggesting contacts there; three years later, the *Liste at Spa* for 27.VII.1786 recorded his visit there:

Le Sr Honnête, Peintre de Portraits en Mignature et Pastel, à l'honneur d'offrir ses services: il vend aussi des assortiments de crayons pour le Pastel d'une nouvelle composition, recouverts de manière à ne point se salir les Mains en peignant. S'adresser chez Carrée, Parfumeur et Confiseur à la Reine d'Hongrie, rue de l'Assemblée.

Subsequently he visited The Netherlands. Nagler, followed by all later sources until corrected here (2025), reports that he died in Frankfurt in 1793. However he was evidently the “Johann Franz Xaver Honnette, Galanteriehändler” who died in Frankfurt 13.VII.1802 and was buried two days later, aged 70 years 6 months (parish records and notice in the *Franckfurter Frag- und Anzeigungs-Nachrichten*, 20.VII.1802).

Faber, following Hüsgen, credits him with the invention of wax pastel. One of the two known examples is similar to the work of a fellow Lorrain, Huin (*q.v.*).
