HAID, Johann Elias

Augsburg 1739–5.IV.1809

The son of Johann Jacob Haid (1704–1767); both were well known engravers. Johann Elias travelled to Venice and The Netherlands, and became head of the Akademie in Augsburg in 1788. Haid was close to Graff, engraving an number of his works (he also engraved pastels by Rosalba). The only known example, a portrait of the celebrated local organ and keyboard-maker, is strong and beautifully, if soberly, coloured.
