HAMILTON, Gustavus

Co. Meath, Ireland ?1745 – Dublin brd 18.XII.1775

Miniaturist and still-life painter in gouache. He was a younger son of a clergyman (also Gustavus, 1696-1755), rector of Gallow, Co. Meath and his wife, Jane Cathcart. He studied under Robert West at the Dublin School, and was awarded Rev. Samuel Madden's premium of 12s. for drawings by under-16 year olds in 1755 (heading the list were Thomas Hickey and Hugh Hamilton); the following year, on 2.XII.1756, he was again awarded a premium (of 10s. 6d.) for drawing by an under-16, with Hickey, Hugh Hamilton and William Peters also recognsied. He was then apprenticed to Samuel Dixon, where he coloured prints of birds and flowers, lodging in Dixon's house in Capel Street, with other pupils, James Reily (q.v.) and the actor John O'Keeffe's brother Daniel. Hamilton became a miniaturist, with a fashionable clientèle and a technique notable for his blue-tinted faces. Only one pastel is possibly attributed to him, but the basis for this is unclear; Sée commented in the 1927 catalogue entry for a misattributed pastel (by Sharples), that "Gustave Hamilton should be watched by the judicious collector, as later on more of is work will be unearthed and he is a coming man."

Gustavus Hamilton died at his lodging at Cork Hill (reported in the *Hibernian journal*, 20.XII.1775) and was buried at St Werburgh's (Church of Ireland), Dublin, on 19.XII.1775, aged 30 according to the register (but given as 36 elsewhere; no baptismal record has been found, but O'Keeffe tells us his brother, born 1740, was younger, while the date of 1739 widely quoted, derived from the *Hamilton memoirs*, would stretch the Dublin Society age limit for premiums), which adds the cause of death as "decay".
