### HUMMER, Erhard

fl. Nürnberg/Vienna c.1730

Also Erhardus von Hummer, Hummert etc. Füßli mentions only that a painter named Hummert, probably from Nürnberg, made portraits, bird-pictures etc. in pastel. He is surely the “Erhard Humer aus Nürnberg ‘acatholisch’, ... ein ‘wohlerfahrner Pastell, auch Portrait maler, wovon man ihn unter die ersten zehlen könne” listed under Lichtenthal (near Baden-Baden) in the list of “Maler, bisher schutzverwandte und unbefugte, ‘denen nach Antrag deren allergnädigsten kaysерlichen Hof-Resolutionen als auch nach den bißhero beobachten Systema’ die Schutzdekrete bewilligt werden sollen” at fol. 280r–286v of the Verwaltungsakten, Karton 1: 1726–41 in the Archiv der bildenden Künste, Vienna. Hummer graduated from the Vienna academy in 1728, although he appears to have worked in Ulm c.1717, as a portrait engraving of a pastor, Johann Peter Miller, engraved by Andreas Matthäus Wolfgang after Hummer, was published there by Johann Gottfried Pfautz.

The Wroclaw collector Albrecht von Sebisch (1685–1746) accumulated a large collection of pictures, including 48 pastels by Hummer only one of which is known today (the collection passed to Ernst Wilhelm von Hubrig who donated it in 1767 to the city of Wroclaw). The pastels were made in Vienna 1728–32 when von Sebisch was on a diplomatic mission, and were no doubt inspired by Rosalba Carriera’s visit. Over half the pastels were small copies of artists’ heads from Sandrart’s *Deutsche Akademie*, but there were also portraits of the collector himself and of the imperial family, as well as at least one copy of a Rosalba genre piece.
