JOUVENET, Jean

Rouen 1.V.1644 - Paris 5.IV.1717

History painter; agréé 1674, reçu 1675, directeur de l'Académie royale, 1705. Jouvenet was close to Charles Le Brun and worked on many of the most prestigious royal commissions, executing mythological paintings for the Tuileries, Versailles and other royal palaces. He was also a sought-after portraitist, with a clientele including various parlementaires from Paris and Normandy. His religious paintings were widely admired and copied. Jouvenet did not work in pastel. As to the single record, as Schnapper & Gouzi 2010 convincingly point out, Jouvenet never copied his own compositions or inverted them as in this example, which must be a copy from a print.
