KILIAN, Christoph Gustav

Augsburg 1724–1776
Member of the extended family of German engravers, son of Georg Kilian (*q.v.*). As well as producing some pastels and engravings, he was a soldier in the Württemberg, Prussian and Dutch services, and a dealer in East Indian goods in The Hague. He admitted to the Confrerie Pictura in The Hague in 1762 (no. 258); Terwesten, who called him "Jacob" Kilian but provided enough details of his career to exclude a homonym, noted his "portretten schilderde en Craijonneerden".
