KUPECKÝ, Jan

Pezinok 1666 – Nürnberg 16.VII.1740 Kupecký (or Kupetzi, or innumerable variants), a Bohemian portraitist, travelled to Vienna and Italy before 1685, and settled in Rome where he developed a personal style derived from numerous influences from Strozzi and Van Dyck to Rigaud. The pastel showing a detail after his self-portrait at the easel (of which there are numerous version) is a copy of a well-know painting; the other attributed work may well also derive from a painting.
