LAFONTAINE, Johann Christoph

Celle 1714 – Hannover 12.II.1760

Third son of Georg Wilhelm (q.n.); his eldest brother Ludolf Ernst Andreas (1704–1774) was also a portraitist. The identification of this goldsmith as the author of the 1751 pastel is not certain; Jean Fontaine (fl. Paris 1750) and Christian Fontaine (qq.n) are proposed as alternatives. Ludolf, a portrait painter in oil and miniature, may have been the teacher of Ernst August Abel (q.n.); he travelled to France, England, Holland, Italy and Switzerland, becoming Hofmaler to Herzog Karl I. von Braunschweig-Wolfenbüttel c.1735. His first wife was a wealthy Englishwoman, his second the daughter of the Hanoverian court surgeon Pierre de Francheville.
