LAMPI, Giovanni Battista I

Romeno 1751 – Vienna 1830

Also Johann Baptist Lampi d. Ä.; important member of this family of Austrian painters, pupil of his father Mathias von Lampi; father of Franz Xaver and Johann Baptist Lampi d. J. Lampi d. Ä. worked in Salzburg (where he was instructed by Franz Nikolaus Streicher, *q.v.*), Verona (where he was a member of the Accademia), Innsbruck (where he taught 1780–83), Vienna (1783, becoming professor at the Akademie in 1786), Warsaw (1788, working for Stanislaw August) and Russia (1791–98), returning to Vienna in 1798. He produced portraits as well as religious paintings, initially in a late baroque manner. A handful of quite different pastels are attributed to him, but until a coherent body of work emerges these should all be regarded as tentative.

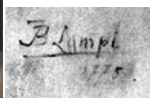

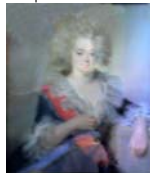
