LE BRUN, Jeanne-Julie-Louise, Mme Gaëtan-Bernard Nigris

Paris 12.II.1780-8.XII.1819

Mme Vigée Le Brun's daughter made several pastels (one is after a pastel by Jakob Orth, q.v.); her mother refers proudly to "ses heureuses dispositions pour la peinture" in her Souvenirs. However their relationship was sometimes strained, particularly after she married, in 1799, Gaëtan-Bernard Nigris (c.1766-?1831), secretary to comte Tchernychev. He was of humble origins (his father Bernardin was secrétaire de l'ambassadeur de Venise, where Gaëtan was born; his mother, née Theodora Eynhouts, was a marchande-lingère). Mme Nigris was in St Petersburg with her mother, who was made an honorary free associate of the Académie des beaux-arts there in 1800, the year in which "Mme Nigri" was appointed ("назначенныя") by the Académie, giving her the right to teach, on the basis of her pastel of the head of a man ("рисунку мужской головы сухими красками"). She soon separated from her husband. Later, in an effort to support herself independently she appeared as Dlle Nigris in the Almanach du commerce de Paris in 1811, rue Saint-Lazare, 83, among the peintresartistes.
