## LEVOZ, François

*fl.* Liège 1781–86

“M. Levoz, Peintre, vis-à-vis des Peres Dominicains” exhibited numerous portraits and still lifes in pastel and other media at the salon de la Société d’Emulation de Liège in each of its exhibitions between 1781 and 1786. His submissions in the first exhibition included portraits of prince Velbruck, the founder of the Société libre d’Emulation de Liège, as did many other exhibitors (although his were the only portraits recorded as in pastel; they may be copies of the oil portrait by Léonard Defrance of which an anonymous pastel is copy is known; a later copy by the comtesse de Renesse is also known). Those in the 1784 exhibition were priced, at a respectable 6 louis each. The name is also found on a sheet of animal studies in graphite and sanguine (Académie des Beaux-Arts de Liège). Identified by Malherbe only as François, he may have been the Edmond-François Levoz who died in Liège, 14.II.1799 aged 59. He was probably related to the Noël-Joseph Levoz (1733–1797), a merchant in Liège responsible for establishing a casino at Spa. A Jean-François Levoz (1762–1823) was cleric de l’église de Jemeppe-sur-Meuse, near Liège.
