### LISIEWSKA, Barbara Rosina, Mme de Gasc

Berlin 10.VII.1713 – Dresden 26.III.1783

Also spelt Rosine, Lisiewski, Liszewska etc.; sister of Christoph Friedrich Reinhold Lisiewski and of Anna Dorothea, Mme Therbusch (*qq.v.*); pupil of their father Jerzy Lisiewski. In 1741 she married the Berlin Hofmaler and portraitist David Matthieu or Mathieu (1697–1755), widower of another of her sisters, Dorothea Elisabeth. In Berlin on 2.X.1760, five years after Matthieu's death, she married the Assessor Louis de Gasc (or Ludwig von Gasc), moving several years later with her husband to Braunschweig where she was appointed court painter in 1777. She also travelled to The Hague (where she was admitted to the Confrerie Pictura in 1767) and Dresden (where she was admitted to the Dresdener Akademie in 1769). She seems to have worked mainly in oil. Her son Leopold and stepson Georg David Matthieu (*qq.v.*) were both pastellists.
